

Kindergarten children were taken on a field trip to a neighbouring police station and fire station. The prospect of going to both locations thrilled them all. The kids went to the fire station first. The many kinds of extinguishers, cutting equipment, and other items used by the fire-fighters were exhibited to and explained to the students. They also witnessed how water is sprayed through the hose pipe to put out the fire, as well as the fire engine and the ladder used to reach higher altitudes. For the students, it was a delightful and incredibly educational event. Children were then brought to the police station. They were taken aback to see police officers in uniform, and they were interested to examine and learn about the technology they carried, such as walkie-talkies. After seeing the control room, they wanted to know how police officers apprehended criminals and kept people safe. The children were thereafter given the chance to learn about the Police Record Updation system. Through this field trip, students were able to get over their anxiety of going into the police station and learned more about community helpers.
